2010 Handicapping League

HOW TO PLAY

- Every Thursday night for eight weeks (January 7 – February 25), teams will meet at their participating home track (Clinton, Western Fair, Hanover, Grand River, Hiawatha, Georgian Downs, Flamboro) and handicap ten races.
- Each week's contest will require teams to pay a \$10 entry fee. Three free programs will be issued to each team and all fees will be added to the \$10,000 grand prize.
- Each group must have a team roster of three players; however, on league nights only two of those three players must be present to submit selections for the contest. Players may only be part of one team, at one track. Team members must remain the same for the duration of the contest. Teams may only make one entry per night.
- Each team must establish a team name and a team captain. The captain will be responsible for submitting picks, receiving prize money and being a contact person for the team.
- When players arrive on league night, they must sign in at the entry table by post time of the first race selected. If two players are not present by this time, the team will not be able to compete in that night's contest.
- Picks will consist of hypothetical \$2 WP wagers on one horse in each desired race.
- Each team will handicap 10 races each night of the contest. There will be five mandatory races from two tracks. These tracks will alternate on a weekly basis. The other five races will be electives from within the three tracks shown at each location (Rideau, Meadowlands, Woodbine). The mandatory races will be released on the ROMP website www.raceromp.com each Tuesday by 7:00 p.m.
- Eligible tracks will include Woodbine, Meadowlands and Rideau Carleton.
- Picks must be submitted by post time of each race selected.
- No mandatory races will begin before 7:30pm.
- Advance picks can be made, but will only be accepted once the entry table is open.
- Picks must be made in person. They will not be accepted via phone, Internet, fax or any other means, under any circumstances.
- Teams do not have to play every week, but must play a minimum of four out of eight weeks to be eligible for the grand prize event. However, teams are encouraged to play weekly, as bankrolls during the eight week tournament are cumulative - the more you play, the better your chances of advancing to the finals.
- Each team's hypothetical bankrolls will be credited with the official payouts should their picks finish first or second.
- Hypothetical bankrolls will be maintained and updated after every race handicapped. By the following day at 3:00 p.m. all scores will be tabulated and the leader board from all seven tracks will be updated with the standings at www.raceromp.com

- One weekly prize of \$100 will be awarded to the team with the highest score each contest night. The \$100 winner will be the team with the top score among all scores from all seven locations collectively. In case of a tie, the winner will be determined by the most first place finishes, then most second place finishes, then highest win payout, then highest place payout. If there is still a tie, the prize will be split evenly.
- Team totals are cumulative over eight consecutive weeks.
- At the end of eight weeks, the two leading teams from each participating racetrack will return to their home track to compete in the final contest.
- All team's bankrolls will return to "0" for the grand prize event on March 4, 2010. The contest structure will remain the same for the final.
- In the case of cancelation of mandatory races, those mandatory races become elective races.

ELIGIBILITY

The ROMP 2010 Handicapping League is a game of skill sponsored by Racetracks of Ontario Marketing and Promotions and is open to legal residents of Canada and the USA, 18 years of age or older (except at Clinton Raceway, where players must be 19+ to enter the facility). Employees of participating racetracks and their affiliates are not eligible to participate.

CONDITIONS

By entering, participants agree to be bound by these complete Official Rules and Regulations and the decisions of ROMP, which shall be final. All Federal, Provincial and local laws apply.

ROMP, contest sponsors and the employees, officers, directors, shareholders, agents, and representatives of participating racetracks and their parent companies, affiliates, subsidiaries and advertising, promotion and legal advisors are not responsible for and shall not be liable for (i) late, lost, delayed, damaged, misdirected, incomplete, illegible, or unintelligible entries; (ii) telephone, electronic, hardware, software, program, network, internet, or computer malfunctions, failures, or difficulties; (iii) errors in transmission; (iv) and condition caused by events beyond the control of ROMP that may cause the contest to be disrupted or corrupted; (v) any injuries, losses, or damages of any kind caused by a prize or resulting from acceptance, possession, or use of a prize, or from participation in the contest; (vi) race cancellations; or (vii) any printing or typographical errors in any materials associated with the contest.

ROMP may prohibit any player from participating in the contest, if at the sole discretion of ROMP, a player repeatedly shows a disregard for the rules, or acts (1) in an unsportsmanlike manner; (2) with an intent to annoy, abuse, threaten, or harass any other player or racetrack representative; or (3) in any other disruptive manner. ROMP may terminate the contest early at its own discretion; provided that all prizes will still be awarded. This promotion is subject to change at any time.

PRIZE STRUCTURE

Weekly prize of \$100 for the leading team.

Grand Prize Round

1st - \$5000 + 50% of added monies + Dinner for 2 for each player at all participating tracks.

2nd - \$2500 + 25% of added monies + Dinner for 2 for each player at all participating tracks.

3rd - \$1200 + 12% of added monies + Dinner for 2 for each player at all participating tracks.

4th - \$800 + 8 % of added monies

5th - \$500 + 5% of added monies

TOTAL PRIZE MONEY - \$10,800 minimum:

- \$800 in weekly prizes
- \$10,000 minimum grand prize, plus all entry fees
